- 1. Completed online application to Carl Sandburg College and if desired, applied for financial aid.
- 2. Requested official copies of my high school or equivalent (GED) transcripts be mailed to the Carl Sandburg College Admission's Office.
- 3. Requested official copies of my college/post-secondary transcripts be mailed to the Carl Sandburg College Admission's Office.
- 4. Verified with Admission's Office that your official transcripts for high school or equivalent (GED) and college/post-secondary transcripts have been received.
- 5. Completed college entrance placement testing within the last five years. Acceptable entrance tests include ACCUPLACER, Compass, and ACT or completion of approved college coursework. The following are minimum Placement test scores required to apply to the program:

- 8. Completed the TEAS exam. **TEAS scores are valid for two years, only three (3) attempts in a 12 month period.** The TEAS testing must be completed prior to the application deadline date. The following are required minimum TEAS scores:

- 10. Attended Health Professions Informational Session prior to applying to the program or prior to the application deadline submission date of March 1. Refer to the Health Professions Informational Session Schedule for dates and times offered.
- 11. Read the Eligibility & Admission Requirements provided on the website prior to completing the Associate Degree Nursing Program Application.
- 12. Met all eligibility requirements. You may submit the **online – College of Nursing Application** to the LPN to RN Articulation. Applications are accepted starting October 1 – March 1 for Fall 2017 admissions into the 2nd year of the Associate Degree Nursing Program.

Meeting all eligibility criteria for selection does not guarantee admission to the 2nd year of the Associate Degree Nursing Program. Admission is competitive and enrollment is limited. Final selection will be based on applicant pool and ranking point system. Applicants who are selected will be notified approximately two weeks after the application deadline date.
