



This is a tentative plan for WHS students to complete one year of an Associate of Arts degree in high school, then enroll at Sandburg for another year to complete the degree. Courses may be switched out based on availability of instructors.

This is a plan for the **AA degree only**. Students who desire an AS degree must meet with a Sandburg academic advisor to develop an individual plan. There is no guarantee a WHS student could complete an AS degree within the 1 + 1 program due to availability of classes.

WHS students will take these courses online, at Sandburg's campus, or at WHS depending on instructor availability.

Students taking dual credit courses must meet Sandburg admissions standards and complete the steps to enroll.

Electives – There are a variety of courses that can meet the elective requirement. The student will work with a Sandburg academic advisor to select the courses that meet this requirement.

Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI) is a statewide transfer agreement which facilitates transfer among more than 100 participating colleges and universities in Illinois. The IAI General Education Core Curriculum (GECC) includes the following categories:

Communication: 3 courses or 9 credit hours

Humanities and Fine Arts: 3 courses total, 1 course must be a Humanities course, 1 course must be a Fine Arts course. The additional course is the student's choice or as directed by the advisor.

Social and Behavioral Sciences: 3 courses or 9 credits total. Courses must be from 3 different subject areas.

Mathematics: 1 course (3-5 credit hours)

Physical Science and Life Sciences: 2 courses total, 1 course from each area (7-8 credit hours). One of the courses must have a lab.

Human Relations: 1 course or 3 credit hours.
